

Ferne worked at the old Naples Town Office and at the Chute Homestead on Rte. 35. She wrote a weekly column for *The Bridgton News* from the early 60s until late last year.

She was a life member of the Edes Falls Sewing Circle, a member of the Methodist Church and choir. Also, she was a past member of the Legion Auxillary, Post #155.

IMPORTANT NOTICES

PUBLIC WELCOME TO ATTEND MEETINGS

Citizen participation is a key element to efficient and effective local government. The Town of Naples' boards and committees welcome residents and taxpayers to attend meetings to ask questions and to express ideas and opinions. The Board of Selectpersons meet every other Monday for meetings or workshops as needed, the Planning Board meets on the first and third Tuesday of each month as needed, the Board of Appeals meets the last Tuesday of the month. Check with the Town Secretary to ensure a meeting is scheduled. These are only a few of the Boards and Committees that meet at the Town Office.

TAX EXEMPT REQUESTS

Tax exempt requests for the 2016-2017 tax year, (beginning July 1st, 2016) must be filed by April 1st, 2016.

HOMESTEAD EXEMPTIONS FOR REAL ESTATE TAXES

In 1998, the 118th Session of the Maine Legislature enacted significant property tax relief in the form of the Homestead Exemption. Qualified residents have assessed value of the "homestead" reduced, adjusted by the municipal assessing ratio. Each year a substantial number of Naples property owners take advantage of this program and have their property taxes reduced.

Qualified residents must apply to their local assessor prior to April 1, 2016 for the 2017 tax year. They must have owned a homestead in Maine for at least twelve months and declare their Naples residence to be their only permanent residence. If you have previously applied for this exemption, you do not need to reapply. Please contact the Town Clerks Office to receive an application.

VETERAN'S EXEMPTIONS FOR REAL ESTATE TAXES

If you are a veteran over the age of 62 (or an un-remarried widow of a veteran who would be 62 if alive); you have a primary residence in Naples; you or your deceased spouse served during a federally recognized war; or if you are a veteran who receives federal funds for 100% disability, then you may be eligible for a real estate property tax exemption. Contact the Municipal Offices at 693-6364.

STATE OF MAINE

BUSINESS PERSONAL PROPERTY TAX REIMBURSEMENT

If you purchased or transferred taxable business property to a Maine Location after April 1, 2004, you may be eligible for the Maine Property Tax Reimbursement Program. Brochures are available at the Municipal Offices.

OWNERSHIP AND ADDRESS UPDATES REQUESTED

Please notify the Municipal Offices when selling or transferring any property to help avoid errors in tax billing. Also, please notify the Tax Collector of any change in mailing address.

WHAT TO BRING WHEN REGISTERING A VEHICLE

Re-Registration: Your old registration, current insurance card & mileage.

New Registration (Dealer Sale): Proof of sales tax paid (this is usually found on the financing statement), blue title application form, window sticker (if new vehicle), current insurance card & mileage.

New Registration (Private Sale): Bill of Sale, title for vehicles 1995 or newer, insurance card & mileage. New Registration (Transfer): Same as private sale registration above PLUS registration of the vehicle the plates are being transferred from. This vehicle must no longer be owned by you in order to receive excise tax credit.

WHAT TO BRING WHEN REGISTERING A SNOWMOBILE/ATV/BOAT/CAMPER:

Re-Registration: Old registration.

Boats Only: Need assigned Maine Registration number.

Mooring renewals: Assigned mooring number.

New Registration (Dealer Sale): Proof of sales tax paid (this is usually found on the financing statement), year, make, and serial number.

New Registration (Private Sale): Bill of sale, year, make and serial number. Horsepower and length for boats.

New Registration (Transfer): Same as private sale above PLUS registration of the vehicle the plates are being transferred from.

DOG LICENSES

Dog Licenses are due January 1st of each year. Rabies certificates are required before the license can be issued. Presentation of spaying or neutering certificate entitles the owner to a reduced fee. Fees are as follows: Unaltered: \$11.00 Spayed or Neutered: \$6.00. A \$25.00 late fee will be charged after January 31st.

TOWN FACILITY USE PERMITS

To use the Bulky Waste, Transfer Station Facilities, or Town Beach you must have a current sticker on your vehicle. The sticker should be placed in the lower left driver's side corner of your windshield so the scale operator can easily see it. Remember when you register a new vehicle to ask for a sticker. The number on the sticker must match your license plate number. If you are borrowing a vehicle you will need to obtain a day pass, you may do this at the Town Office during business hours. If you have questions about what can and can't be taken to the Transfer Station facility please call them at 627-7585.

BULKY WASTE COUPON PROGRAM

Naples Property owners will receive one booklet per lot annually at the beginning of every July. Duplicates will not be issued. Pay at the Gate: Naples Residents with a town recycling sticker can deliver refuse for \$0.05 per pound and brush/wood for \$0.25 per pound beyond the coupon(s) value. Commercial haulers must pay at the gate unless they have coupons and a coupon transfer from a Naples Property Owner. Bulky Waste Coupons: Annually each owner may have a coupon booklet issued to them. Each Booklet is worth 2,000 pounds of bulky waste. As the deliveries are made the Facility will take coupon(s) IN 20 POUND INCREMENTS. When a resident has delivered more weight than the coupons allow they must pay the overage at the gate. When a resident exhausts their coupons, they must pay at the gate.

TOWN MANAGER'S REPORT

Over the last year it has been a pleasure to serve as the Town Manager of Naples. I would first like to thank the staff and volunteers of the town for their hard work during this time of transition. Significant changes have been made in town operations and infrastructure requiring extra time and dedication on their part. Without this commitment, our town would not be the municipality that it is today.

Since July 2014, the Town of Naples has invested heavily in building improvements financed through capital reserves. The Town Office now has new carpet and LED lights while the Fire Station has had its apparatus floors, training room and kitchen completely remodeled. Work crews from the Cumberland County Sheriff's Office Community Services Program saved the town thousands of dollars by painting these two facilities. With older facilities we will strive to update our maintenance program to extend the life of our buildings

This year the taxpayers of the Town of Naples will be asked to purchase a former Maine Department of Transportation Facility located on Route 11. This two acre property, complete with a four bay garage and smaller separate garage, is proposed to serve as the Town's first small scale maintenance department. \$95,000 of the \$115,300 purchase price is proposed to come from reserve accounts with the remaining balance to be raised this year. While not a public works facility, this property will help the Town overcome a major storage problem for vehicles, road materials and equipment and also serve as an auxiliary fire station alleviating a space issue at the main fire station. Should the Town wish to not use the property in the future after a purchase, MDOT will purchase the property back from the Town for the purchase price. I strongly feel that this purchase is in the best interests of the citizens of Naples and allows the Town to maintain its maintenance capability as Naples continues to grow.

Capital road improvements continue to be a high priority for our community. We will continue to schedule road projects which includes paving on Chaplin's Mill and Cooks Mills Road as scheduled by my predecessor. Improvements to bad sections of Lakehouse Road and Songo School Road are also in the works. Looking to 2017, we hope to plan work around another major road bond which would include improvements to Gore Road. As one of the few Cumberland County communities without its own public works department I ask that citizens of Naples be patient with minor road issues as we are dependent on the availability of contractors to complete repairs. Overall, Naples has maintained its road network better than most communities and will continue to put an emphasis on roads.

To the Residents and Taxpayers of the Town of Naples,

It has been a very solid year for your Selectboard in the Town this 2015 fiscal year. It started with a new Town Manager who started his job on July 1st, 2014 and has been doing an outstanding job looking out for your interest in the community. He has updated many out of date policies that the Town needed to improve on with the approval from the Selectboard.

We started the year a bit rough after having the approval from the taxpayers to buy a parcel of land adjacent to the fire station that had a contaminated well. The purchase was made more economical because the Selectboard planned to sell off property that the Town currently owns to offset this purchase price. Unfortunately the Town's ordinances were not properly set up to allow this to happen, and our law firm recommended to update the ordinance this year at the town meeting so we can legally move forward with our commitment.

The Town also felt it was time to replace our long time legal team with a new firm, and we are now under the guidance of Jensen, Baird Gardner & Henry. One of their first priorities was to review all current ordinances the Town has on the books and give us advice if they are still legal or need to be updated. This process will take some time to accomplish and any updating that will be required will be done through the proper departments and will be brought to the taxpayers for their approval if needed.

This spring the Town's fire department has received a nice facelift of updating the inside of the facility. Interior painting, replacements of flooring and new cabinets in the kitchen will allow our current staff the ability to better utilize the facility.

This summer also starts the new Street Vendor Ordinance, that was approved two years ago, but the Selectboard decided to wait a year before implementing it to allow all of us time to get a better understanding of how best to make it work.

Your Selectboard continues to work hard on your behalf and always puts the interest of the taxpayers and residents first. There is much work ahead for us to do as the Town continues to grow. With this growth there will always be new challenges that will need to be addressed.

We hope you all enjoy the 2015 summer months and remember we are here to work for you, so any time you have a question or a concern please feel free to email us or stop by one of our biweekly meetings to express your thoughts or concerns as our doors are always open.

CODE ENFORCEMENT OFFICER'S REPORT 2015



My name is Renee' Carter and I am the Code Enforcement Officer for the Town of Naples. It has been a great pleasure working with the citizens and the many Boards. People often ask "when do I need a building permit"? The answer to that is found in many of our individual ordinances. There is an actual building permit ordinance which states that "whoever shall renovate an existing structure, construct or cause or suffer to be constructed upon his or her property any structure, shall apply to the building inspector". So, if you are renovating, installing new wiring, adding new plumbing, or deciding to finish off a family room then you need a building permit. If you are unsure, the easiest thing to do is to call me and I will go over what you are planning on doing and we can go from there. I am here to help you and I enjoy doing that.

The other question that I get is about the shorefront property. A lot of people think that once they are outside of the 100' setback from the water that the land can be cleared and that there are no regulations. This too is not true. Around all of the lakes the land is zoned Shoreland Zoning 250' from the water. The regulations cover structures, trees, vegetation removal, the amount of vegetation needed per lot, driveways, walkways, decks, docks, moorings and so on. Again, please call me if you have any questions.

There were 182 building permits issued, of which 15 were new single-family residences. And there were 77 plumbing permits issued, of those 23 were new septic systems.

I enjoy working with the Selectboard, Planning Board, Appeals Board and Ordinance Review Committee. Naples is uniquely beautiful. Not only is it surrounded by lakes, streams and ponds with great views it has a warm and caring community.

I enjoy meeting you, stop on by.

Naples Fire Rescue Department 2015

This has been a very busy year for the department with changes to personnel and upgrades to the building. Several new members were hired; Firefighter/Paramedic Jonathon Morrison, Firefighter Joshua Stevens, Firefighter/EMT Daniel Hillier, EMT Danielle Small and Responder Kristy Eyles. Captain Galvin will be completing his Advanced EMT certification which consisted of 6 months of classroom and on the job training time. The departments call volume and not changed much from the previous year with a total of 755 fire and rescue calls, 68% rescue and 32% fire and 60 mutual aid calls.

There were several remodeling projects providing a much needed face lift to the fire station, the training room was painted and new floors installed, the apparatus bays were completely painted and the floors were stripped refinished. The kitchen is still in the planning stages of a remodel.

The department is now offering Cardiopulmonary Resuscitation (CPR) and Basic First Aid courses monthly. For sign up and available dates go to the Naples Fire Department web site at naplesfireandrescue.org. The department will also be offering courtesy car seat inspection. We currently have one member working on completing his national certification, and will be scheduling monthly inspections.

As a reminder, burning permits are required for all open burning. Burning permits are available from the town office and Casco/Naples Transfer Station on weekends. Permits are also available online at burningpermits.com. Permits will be issued between the hours of 0900 and 1pm and expire at midnight on the date of issue. For additional information on burning regulations go to the Town of Naples Website.



Marine Safety 2014-2015



2014-2015 was a very safe year as far as boating in Naples. There were some minor injuries and accidents, but nothing major or life threatening. The Marine Safety volunteers spent many hours on our lakes promoting safe boating. All members that are allowed on patrol alone have been certified to a minimum of "Basic Harbormaster", by the State of Maine.

The new causeway has been a draw to many area boaters, making it a much busier area. Parking spaces for boats are becoming as difficult to find as parking for vehicles on many days, especially weekends. Some planning for more dock space and or time limits on docking may have to be a topic for the near future. Our own volunteers sometimes can't find car parking in order to go out on patrol. Boats cruising the causeway area sometimes get in arguments with other boaters waiting for the "next open space". Time limits may help this problem. We have seen boats tied up to the town dock for the entire day.

I would like to thank the following for their continued support and cooperation;

Year Ended 6/30/15

After a year which saw the Dunkin Donuts and Family Dollar Store projects on Route 302 approved, we entered a period with little development activity. We spent a fair amount of time with applications for approval of outdoor activities. In July, we gave final approval to the 2014 Naples for the Arts Festival. The Naples Blues Festival and the annual Wheels and Water Show had previously been approved at our June meeting. We approved at our August meeting, the Lions Club apple and pie sale on the causeway for Fryberg Fair weekend and in December we approved the 2015 Naples for the Arts Festival.

In March, we gave approval for the Naples Causeway 5K which will take place on August 30. This walk/run will start at the field between Moose Landing and Brays and proceed up Route 114 to State Park Road where it will reverse direction and return to the starting point. The event will benefit the Dempsey Centre at CMMC and local food pantries.

We had a preliminary discussion on modifications to two existing business locations but no applications have yet been submitted. We also had a preliminary discussion on a possible four lot subdivision on Song School Road.

Finally, we allowed a modification to an existing subdivision plan. The subdivision plan required buffer zones between adjoining lots and a septic system had encroached on the buffer zone. Both the abuttor and the Homeowners Association supported the change which the Board approved by unanimous vote.

As we begin a new year, the Cumberland County Sheriff's Office continues to be committed to providing you with the most efficient, professional, and community-oriented law enforcement services possible.

As of the date of this letter, the Cumberland County Sheriff's Office has responded to nearly 1,900 calls for service in Naples.

Unfortunately, we have seen an increase in the number of thefts throughout Cumberland County throughout the past year. The increase in thefts have namely been for the suspects to support their drug addiction. I encourage the citizens of Naples to keep the doors of their residence and vehicles locked and remain vigilant of suspicious activity in the community.

We are continuing with the CALEA (Commission of Accreditation for Law Enforcement Agencies) process, which has been in progress for two and a half years. The accreditation process requires us to take a close look at the way "we do business", to analyze it, and determine if we are utilizing best practices. We have become one of a few law enforcement agencies in a network of law enforcement agencies that support each other, and value the level of services that we provide to the citizens of Cumberland County. We have scheduled our final audit for June of 2015, so we will be accredited by July.





Report on the Financial Statements

We have audited the accompanying financial statements of the governmental activities, each major fund, and the aggregate remaining fund information of the Town of Naples, as of and for the year ended June 30, 2014, and the related notes to the financial statements, which collectively comprise the Town's basic financial statements as listed in the table of contents.

Management's Responsibility for the Financial Statements

Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of these financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America; this includes the design, implementation, and maintenance of internal control relevant to the preparation and fair presentation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error.

Auditors' Responsibility

Our responsibility is to express opinions on these financial statements based on our audit. We conducted our audit in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America issued by the Comptroller General of the United States. Those standards require that we plan and perform the audit to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements are free of material misstatement.

We do not express an opinion or provide any assurance on the information because the limited procedures do not provide us with sufficient evidence to express an opinion or provide any assurance.

Other Information

Our audit was conducted for the purpose of forming opinions on the financial statements that collectively comprise the Town of Naples's basic financial statements. The combining and individual non-major fund financial statements are presented for purposes of additional analysis and are not a required part of the basic financial statements.

The combining and individual non-major fund financial statements are the responsibility of management and were derived from and related directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the basic financial statements. Such information has been subjected to the auditing procedures applied in the audit of the basic financial statements and certain additional procedures, including comparing and reconciling such information directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the basic financial statements or to the basic financial statements themselves, and other additional procedures in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America. In our opinion, the combining and individual nonmajor fund financial statements are fairly stated in all material respects in relation to the basic financial statements as a whole.

**REQUIRED SUPPLEMENTARY INFORMATION
MANAGEMENT'S DISCUSSION AND ANALYSIS
JUNE 30, 2014
(UNAUDITED)**

The following management's discussion and analysis of the Town of Naples financial performance provides an overview of the Town's financial activities for the fiscal year ended June 30, 2014. Please read it in conjunction with the Town's financial statements.

Financial Statement Overview

The Town of Naples basic financial statements include the following components: 1) government-wide financial statements, 2) fund financial statements, and 3) notes to the financial statements. This report also includes required supplementary information which consists of the general fund budgetary comparison schedule, and other supplementary information which includes combining and other schedules.

Basic Financial Statements

The basic financial statements include financial information in two differing views: the government-wide financial statements and the fund financial statements. These basic financial statements also include the notes to financial statements that explain in more detail certain information in the financial statements and also provide the user with the accounting policies used in the preparation of the financial statements.

Government-Wide Financial Statements

The government-wide financial statements provide a broad view of the Town's operations in a manner that is similar to private businesses. These statements provide both short-term as well as long-term information in regards to the Town's financial position. These financial statements are prepared using the accrual basis of accounting. This measurement focus takes into account all revenues and expenses associated with the fiscal year regardless of when cash is received or paid. The government-wide financial statements include the following two statements:

The Statement of Net Position – this statement presents *all* of the government's assets, deferred outflows of resources, liabilities and deferred inflows of resources with the difference being reported as net position.

The Statement of Activities – this statement presents information that shows how the government's net position changed during the period. All changes in net position are reported as soon as the underlying event giving rise to the change occurs, regardless of the timing of the related cash flows.

Both of the above mentioned financial statements have one column for the one type of town activity. The type of activity presented for the Town of Naples is:

- *Governmental activities* – The activities in this section are mostly supported by taxes and intergovernmental revenues (federal and state grants). Most of the Town's basic services are reported in governmental activities, which include general government, public safety, public works, education, health and sanitation, recreation and culture and other unclassified.

Fund Financial Statements

A fund is a grouping of related accounts that is used to maintain control over resources that have been segregated for specific activities or objectives. The Town of Naples, like other local governments uses fund accounting to ensure and demonstrate compliance with financial related legal requirements. All of the funds of the Town of Naples can be divided into two categories: governmental funds and fiduciary funds.

Governmental funds: Most of the basic services provided by the Town are financed through governmental funds. Governmental funds are used to account for essentially the same functions reported in governmental activities in the government-wide financial statements. However, unlike the government-wide financial statements, the governmental fund financial statements focus on near-term inflows and outflows of spendable resources. They also focus on the balance of spendable resources available at the end of the fiscal year. Such information will be useful in evaluating the government's near-term financing requirements. This approach is known as the current financial resources measurement focus and the modified accrual basis of accounting. Under this approach revenues are recorded when cash is received or when susceptible to accrual. Expenditures are recorded when liabilities are incurred and due. These statements provide a detailed short-term view of the Town's finances to assist in determining whether there will be adequate financial resources available to meet the current needs of the Town.

Because the focus of governmental funds is narrower than that of government-wide financial statements, it is useful to compare the information presented for governmental funds with similar information presented for governmental activities in the government-wide financial statements. By doing so, readers may better understand the long-term impact of the government's near-term financing decisions. Both the governmental fund balance sheet and the governmental fund statement of revenues, expenditures and changes in fund balances provide a reconciliation to facilitate this comparison between governmental funds and governmental activities. These reconciliations are presented on the page immediately following each governmental fund financial statement.

The Town of Naples presents four columns in the governmental funds balance sheet and the governmental fund statement of revenues, expenditures and changes in fund balances. The Town's major governmental funds are the General Fund, Highways and Bridges, and Chaplin Trust. All other funds are shown as nonmajor and are combined in the "Other Governmental Funds" column on these statements.

The general fund is the only fund for which the Town legally adopted a budget. The Budgetary Comparison Schedule – Budgetary Basis – Budget and Actual – General Fund provides a comparison of the original and final budget and the actual expenditures for the current year.

Fiduciary Funds: These funds are used to account for resources held for the benefit of parties outside the Town of Naples. These funds are not reflected in the government-wide financial statements because the resources of these funds are not available to support the Town's own programs. The accounting used for fiduciary funds are much like that of proprietary funds. They use the accrual basis of accounting.

Notes to the Financial Statements

The notes provide additional information that is essential to a full understanding of the data provided in the Government-Wide and the Fund Financial Statements. The Notes to Financial Statements can be found following the Fiduciary Fund Financial Statements.

Required Supplementary Information

The basic financial statements are followed by a section of required supplementary information, which includes a Budgetary Comparison Schedule – Budgetary Basis – Budget and Actual – General Fund.

Other Supplementary Information

Other supplementary information follows the required supplementary information. These combining and other schedules provide information in regards to nonmajor funds, capital asset activity and other detailed budgetary information for the general fund.

Government-Wide Financial Analysis

Our analysis below focuses on the net position, and changes in net position of the Town's governmental activities. The Town's total net position decreased by \$37,751 from \$9,621,639 to \$9,583,888.

Unrestricted net position - the part of net position that can be used to finance day-to-day operations without constraints established by debt covenants, enabling legislation, or other legal requirements - decreased to a balance of \$3,825,053 at the end of this year.

Revenues and Expenses

Revenues for the Town's governmental activities increased by 3.88%, while total expenses decreased by 1.01%. The increase in revenues is largely due to taxes. The biggest decrease in expenses was in capital outlay.

Governmental funds: The financial reporting focus of the Town's governmental funds is to provide information on near-term inflows, outflows, and balances of spendable resources. Such information may be useful in assessing the Town's financial requirements. In particular, unassigned fund balance may serve as a useful measure of a government's financial position at the end of the year, and the net resources available for spending.

The general fund total fund balance decreased by \$321,654 from the prior fiscal year. Highways and bridges decreased by \$150,178, and the Chaplin trust decreased by \$44,701. The non-major fund balances increased by \$157,681 from the prior fiscal year.

Budgetary Highlights

There was a significant difference between the original and final budget for the general fund. The difference was the use of committed fund balances.

The general fund actual revenues were under budget by \$35,250.

The general fund actual expenditures were under budget by \$419,298. All expenditure categories were under budget with the exception of general government, public works and debt service.

Capital Asset and Debt Administration

Capital Assets

As of June 30, 2014, the net book value of capital assets recorded by the Town decreased by \$304,482 from the prior year. This is the result of current year additions of \$528,965 less current year depreciation of \$833,447.

At June 30, 2014, the Town had \$2,375,594 in bonds payable outstanding versus \$2,815,960 last fiscal year, a decrease of 15.64%. Other obligations include accrued vacation and sick time. Refer to Note 5 of Notes to Financial Statements for more detailed information.

The Town has steadily maintained a sufficient unassigned fund balance to sustain governmental operations for a period of two to three months, while also maintaining reserve accounts for future capital and program needs.
