Larry Anton called the meeting to order at 7:00 pm. Also present were Jim Allen, Kathy Sweet, John Thompson, Jeff Juneau , Kevin Rogers and Barbara McDonough.

First order of business to read and approve the minutes of April 19th, 2011. John made a motion to approve the minutes as written. Jim seconded the motion. Motion passed.

The next order of business:

An application for an Outdoor Entertainment Permit for Harvest Hills Animal Shelter submitted by Bobby Silcott. Bobby was not present but had previously explained the nature of the event to Secretary, Barbara McDonough. Barbara explained to the Planning Board members this is the 2nd Annual Dog Paddle Cruise with 100% of the proceeds to benefit Harvest Hills Animal Shelter. They anticipate 200 people aboard the Songo River Queen II between the hours of 8-10 pm on July 8th, 2011. Parking will be available on the causeway as it is in normal sailing. Toilet facilities are as they are in normal sailing, aboard the boat. Trash collection is not applicable; the staff aboard the boat will be responsible for trash removal and disposal. Hours of alcohol being served will be from 8-10pm. There is no impact on public safety. Jim made a motion to approve the event. Kathy seconded the motion. Motion passed.

An application for an Outdoor Entertainment Permit for the Maine Blues Festival submitted by the Blues Festival Committee. Jill Steinman and Michael Bray were present, along with 2 other representatives for the Blues Festival Committee. The event is on the weekend of June 18th, music does begin on Friday night but the majority of the acts are on Saturday. Hours of operation are Friday 7-9 pm, Saturday 10-12 midnight and Sunday 11-1 pm. No outdoor alcohol to be served unless allowed at the establishment by the State of Maine. Locations of events are Village Green, Songo River Queen, Tail of the Lake, Mercedes, Brays, Augustis Bove House and the Fire Department vendor stand on the Causeway. Parking facilities are on the causeway, Route 302, & 114. Shuttle buses are available along the causeway and go to the American Legion. 12 porta potties will be available at various locations. Trash barrels will be placed on the Village Green and trash will be collected by hand Saturday morning. 2 Sheriffs will be provided as well as extra deputies and private security. Traffic impact should be minimal with the new configuration of the causeway. Impact on public safety should be no more than the usual past gatherings. A list of vendor and music locations was provided

as well as an aerial depicting activity. Jim made a motion to approve the application as presented. Kathy seconded the motion. Motion passed.
